


	<p>Jack supports openness and transparency in government. Staff had blackened out all the relevant information in its communications with the Federal government about a proposed \$50 million train station. Last year, Jack displayed the redacted document as he sponsored a resolution for full disclosure.</p>	<p>Jack's opponent told <i>The Ann Arbor News</i> that he would have voted with the City Council majority against disclosing these communications to the public.</p>										
	<p>Jack supported allowing voters to determine the fate of the Library Lot after petitions to do that failed due to technicalities. Enough interest in the subject was demonstrated that Council should have allowed the voters to decide. Jack also opposed selling the lot to Core Spaces of Chicago to build a massive, 17-story structure in the heart of our downtown.</p>	<p>Jack's opponent told <i>The Ann Arbor News</i> that he opposed allowing the voters access to the ballot to decide the fate of the Library Lot. He would have allowed technicalities to block residents from being able to vote on the sale of that city-owned asset.</p>										
 <p>WASHTENAW COUNTY COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH www.ewashtenaw.org</p>	<p>Jack supports funding mental health services but opposed redirecting the city's share of a prospective County millage without considering a range of alternatives, including a city property tax cut and adequate funding of retiree benefits.</p>	<p>Jack's opponent told the League that he supports the Council majority's hasty and premature action allocating to unrelated purposes the city's share of the county-wide millage proposed for mental health and law enforcement.</p>
